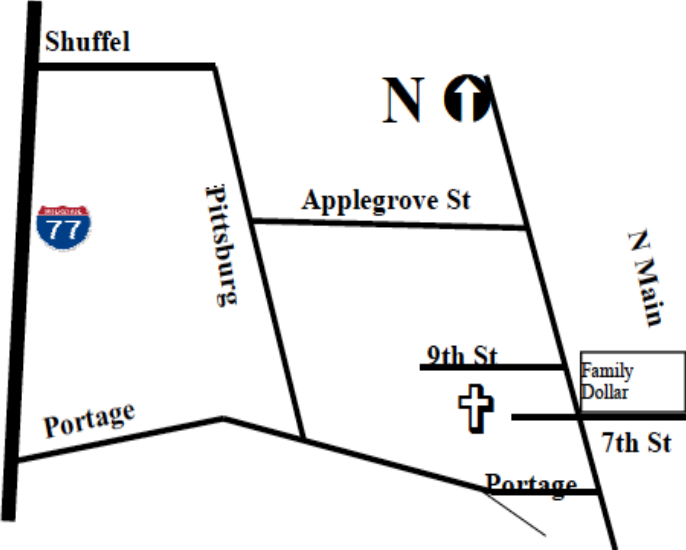

We would encourage you NOT to deprive your valued youth of this important and potential life changing experience because you don't want them to miss out on an Emmaus Walk – God is alive and working through both experiences! Our youth need all of the tools they can get a handle of as they navigate this difficult stage of their lives and before they head out into the world of college, the military or work force.

HOW CAN I SUPPORT CHRYSALIS?

PRAY, PRAY AND PRAY some more – Rich and Lisa are still looking for a few good team members and are in the middle of team formation. We need prayers for formation, team members, the caterpillars, logistical arrangements, cooperation and communication between communities.

Can you imagine how mind blowing it will be to youth to walk into a barn filled with loving people in the glow of the candles? Be the face of Jesus on Saturday night and come encourage the new 4th day at Closing on Sunday.

So You Want to Serve on an Emmaus Team?

You may be excited or anxious to be part of the agape love showered onto pilgrims by team members; or you may want to see what a weekend looks like from a team member's perspective. So, what does serving on an Emmaus team require? In two simple words, "humble servant hood." Team members are reminded that serving on a weekend Walk to Emmaus team is a privilege, not a right. It requires discipline, sacrifice, commitment and obedience to authority.

Remember the first talk of the weekend, "How do you spend your time, money, and what do you think about? This is your Priority." Serving on a team is a sacrifice of your (and your family's) time and money, and must be a priority. Commitment of time is one of the hardest acts of servant hood required of a team member. Team meetings generally last about four hours each and are held once a week (often on a Saturday) for approximately 10-12 consecutive weeks. Talk Preview Day may be an all day meeting. Attendance at all team meetings is a requirement, and is essential to build a strong Christian community that readies the team to serve the pilgrims. Also, attendance throughout the entire 72 hour weekend is mandatory, and team members are also asked to observe the same submission to the weekend that is expected of the pilgrims.

Probably the second hardest commitment to serving on a team is the sacrifice of money. The weekend cost is the same for pilgrims and team members (\$140) and covers things like camp lodging & meals, weekend supplies, and fees to The Upper Room. In addition to the weekend fee, there are some minor costs during team formation (generally around \$15.00). Team members contribute towards the bell given to the Lay Leader, the commissioning meal for the team and spouses generally held the last team meeting, and the Thursday night meal at Camp Wanake. Depending on the position, some team members may also have expenses for things like table and chapel decorations, props for skits, and copies of talk handouts. While every attempt is made to keep team members' costs low so serving on a team is not a financial hardship, it is fair to say it requires a sacrifice of money.

Teams follow the "One-third Rule" meaning: 1/3 are first time team members; 1/3 have been on 1-3 teams; and 1/3 have served on 4 or more teams. This guideline helps mentor newer team members, broadens involvement of the community, and prevents the same old veterans from serving team after team. Given this guideline and the blessing of having such a large community (over 4,500 to date), there are many names to choose from and it may take a while for individuals to be invited to serve on a team but don't get discouraged. Fill out the "Ways to Serve" form, attend Gatherings, Candlelight, and other EOEE functions, and be a visible presence in the community.

Yes, serving on an Emmaus team requires discipline, sacrifice, commitment and obedience to authority; as well as a sacrifice of your time and money, but it is one of the most rewarding things you will ever do. Not only will you be blessed by humble servant hood helping being others into a closer relationship with Christ, your own spiritual life will grow stronger as you worship and fellowship with Christian brothers and sisters in preparation for the Walk.

EOEE Board Responsibilities

Team Selection Committee

Recently, the EOEE Board of Directors discussed opportunities we might have as a Board to educate you all in 4th Day about the functions of the varying committees that comprise the Board.

In this article, I will share with you the function of the Selection Committee.

The purpose of the Selection Committee is to oversee the formation of the teams that will serve the Pilgrims on the Emmaus weekend. Once the board selects the Weekend Lay Leaders, those selected go through a 15-18 months process of preparation. Their experience will include being an Assistant Weekend Lay Leader and then preparation of their own teams when they lead their own weekend.

The Selection Committee meets 1 hour prior to the Board meeting, which is held the 3rd Monday of the month. The committee is comprised of the Ex Officio (that person who has been Community Lay Leader the previous year), the Community Spiritual Directors (Ken Price, Scott Hindel) and 6 mentors who are assigned individually to an upcoming Weekend Lay Leader. Currently Randy & Rosemary Dessecker, Sharon Buccatelli, Tom Raddish, Debbie Crawl and Harry Poston are serving in this role. Of course the Weekend Lay Leaders attend as well.

The committee primarily will evaluate the list of potential team members that a Weekend Lay Leader submits. This is known as the 100s list. It should be divided in the following manner based on the number of teams that each person has served on: 1/3 0 teams, 1/3 1-3 teams, 1/3 4 or more teams. The committee aids in making sure that persons with experience are put in leadership roles and that inexperienced people are divided in the groups under that leadership. We also encourage people to be placed in team roles that would qualify them to be future Weekend Lay Leaders. After teams are formed, the committee will follow the Lay Leader through a checklist of different things that need to be done as the team formation process proceeds. This would include, Weekend Scripture verse, song, banner, church where team formation will occur and the schedule of formation.

The committee is not in a role where onerous rules and regulations are placed on the Lay Leaders but in fact, we are in a supportive nurturing role to help these people that God has called to lead through a very challenging time. It is an overwhelming and exciting experience to lead a weekend. It helps to know that you have a mentor and a group of people to walk with you through that process.
